

# Plein Air Peconic

The **Peconic Land Trust** is proud to sponsor the traveling exhibition of **Plein Air Peconic** – a visual showcase of conserved landscapes throughout the East End of Long Island.

Since 1983, the **Peconic Land Trust** has worked diligently to conserve Long Island's working farmland, natural lands and heritage. The **Peconic Land Trust** works with landowners, municipalities and other complimentary organizations to ensure that the rural heritage of Long Island is conserved for future generations. The Trust, which is a nonprofit organization, raises its funds for operating and conservation projects primarily through donations from the public.



As of the beginning of 2007, the **Peconic Land Trust** has conserved over 8,500 acres of land, representing over 330 individual projects. These conservation projects have resulted in xx of conserved farmland, xx acres of hiking trails and other natural land conservations – that provide protection and sustainability for scenic vistas, watersheds, ocean front and wildlife habitats.



The work presented at **Plein Air Peconic** was created in the late summer of 2006. The **Peconic Land Trust** secured access for the artists to a variety of conserved landscapes – including Reel Point, Quail Hill, Latham Farm, Tramaridge Stream, Dam Pond, Scallop Pond and Hallockville.

Generously, the artists participating in Plein Air Peconic are donating a portion of the sale from their work on display to the **Peconic Land Trust**.
